## Background

Every Macintosh program has two four character codes associated with it - its Type and Creator. The latter is unique to each program and enables the Finder to attach documents to their parent applications. This database tries to compile as many codes as possible.

**Q** Will Apple give developers a list of Creator and File types that have already been registered?

**A** Unfortunately, no. We don't make the information in the Creator/File Type Registration database available. You should be aware, however, that you can use the search form to search the database to see if a Creator type has been claimed.

## Sending in new codes:

New entries are always welcome.  
Please try to adhere to the given format:

**Name , Type , Creator , Comment**

Names of data files that belong to applications should point to the "parent" application. The current version has some files with unrelated names, which I included hoping for someone to give the correct pointer. Where possible I used the Creator code to identify the parent application - and put the name in the "related info" field.

## Using the DATA

5 fields are available:

1. **Name** of file or application
2. **Type** code
3. **Creator** code
4. **Related information.**

Here can be either a general typing comment (DA, cdev, application) or a name of a related file - mostly the creating application.

5. **Category** - a comment further qualifying the the entry.

For 2 and 3, Codes with "\*\*\*\*\*" mean "anything goes here".

Some Creator codes are "????". Either the code was unknown to me or (in some cases) it IS the code. This happens usually with shareware and games, and sometimes with demo files for various compilers.

Some tools have the same codes (by nature of their function) and different names. Some codes are "pirated" - i.e not authorized by Apple. I can't verify that.

### Errors in data

Many of the entries are for ShareWare programs. The codes these ShareWare programs use may contradict with codes "registered" at Apple™. So be careful. There sure are many errors in such a big, voluntary list.

A typical error - some codes consist of lower/upper case letters. In the long way from the sender to me the "case" might change and be wrong.

## Using the Program

The first line in the main window is the title line. All other include the data itself.  
Most functions are in the **View menu**, some are available only by using the mouse.

### Sorting by field

You can sort the table by any title. Just click on the title. Or use the **View menu** commands.  
Sort is Case-Sensitive.

### Selecting by any criterion

You can select any group by a criterion you define with the **Find entry** of the View menu.

**Find all** restores the original state.

### Selecting FONT

The **Font** command in the **View menu** allows to select a font to you liking.  
Best leave it at the default (monospaced) Monaco 9.

### Setting column width

Drag the column marker to change the width of any column (Excel style)

### Exporting data

The current "find set" is written to a Tab Delimited Text file with Type / Creator of TEXT/R\*ch (BBedit)

You can use the text file as source for a FileMaker database. Just use the template included with the package.



## IN CASE OF PROBLEMS

1. Throw out the preference file TCReader Prefs from the system Preferences folder.
2. Increase RAM allocation via the Get Info... dialog for the application.
3. On **PowerMACs** this application needs even more RAM.
4. For those of you who read the instructions -  
Look for an Easter Egg in the About screen - hint: click with modifier(s) ;-)

## Future plans:

The Database engine program may be enhanced if there is enough interest.

Possibilities:

Enhanced preference setting. Allow setting default values.

Allow printing of a selected set.

Allow "copy" of information from the list for pasting in the "find" dialog. Drag and drop.

Allow modifying, adding, deleting and importing of new data. (hint - this makes the program a small database tool !)

## Problem

This project is getting "saturated". So do I :-)

The size of the database reaches Excel's limit of 16K lines.

I need another tool. Maybe some FileMaker Pro system. Any help will be welcome.

Also, the time and effort it takes me is starting to be too much. Any volunteers to help? Buy it?

## Contributors:

As the contribution is an alternative fee, I see no need in mentioning names.

But I must mention **Mikael Grounes** from Sweden who sent me 2 diskettes full of "FileList" listings. All of his CDROMS and disk files were listed. There were many thousands of file names and codes. This was so much work for me to organize, that it took me 8 month to complete (in my scarce spare time)... The main obstacle was that I had to comb the data for duplicates, find "meanings" of data files etc. That's why I ask for a special format when sending in codes. Most of the new entries for version 2.0 were from his data.

**Nikolas Kovalenko** donated his list with thousands entries, of which many were new to me, and many of the others were corrections to my data. Nik maintains a similar database with ICONs ;-)  
Nik still is the main source for the new codes. He actively searches every new computer he happens to run into, and maintains his own codes database. Thank you Nik!
