



Installing Your Apple Font Pack Fonts and Software

This booklet tells you how to install your Apple Font Pack fonts and printer software onto a hard disk attached to your Macintosh computer. You'll find instructions for:

- using the Installer program to install all of your fonts and printer software
- installing just the fonts you need, along with the printer software

Before you install

Before you install your fonts and printer software, you need to protect your original disks (by locking them and making copies of them), and you need to make sure you have system software version 7.0 or later.

To find out how to protect your disks and check your system software, see the books that came with your computer.

Installing all the fonts and software

Follow the steps below to use the Installer program to install your fonts and the software your Macintosh needs in order to work with the fonts. This procedure installs all of the Apple Font Pack fonts. To install only certain fonts, see the next section, “Installing Individual Fonts.”

- △ Important: Before you install, turn off any automatic virus-detection programs you have on your Macintosh. If you don't, problems may occur. After installation is complete, you can turn the virus-detection programs back on. △

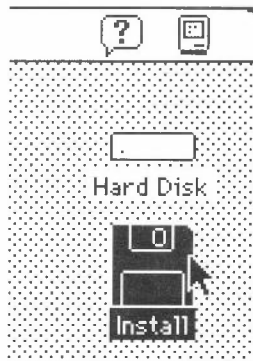
1. Make sure you're working on the desktop.

If your computer is off, turn it on. If it's already on, quit any programs that are open.

2. Insert the disk labeled *Install*.

The disk's icon appears on the desktop.

3. Open the disk by double-clicking its icon.



4. Open the Installer by double-clicking its icon.

A Welcome box displays information about the files that will be installed.

5. Click OK to continue.

An Install box appears.

6. Click Install.

7. When the *Install* disk is ejected, follow the instructions you see on the screen.

You'll have to swap disks a few more times. Each time, the Installer ejects one disk and asks you to insert another.

8. When you see a message reporting that the installation was successful, follow the instructions on the screen.

If you turned off any automatic virus-detection programs you have on your Macintosh, turn them back on now.

Installing individual fonts

If the space on your hard disk is limited, or if you do not need all of your Apple Font Pack fonts, you can install only the fonts you want to use. To install a font, follow these steps:

1. Make sure you're working on the desktop.

If your computer is off, turn it on. If it's already on, quit any programs that are open.

2. Insert the floppy disk that contains the font you want to install.

The disk's icon appears on the desktop.

3. Open the disk by double-clicking its icon.

4. **Locate the icon of the font you want to install, and drag it to the System Folder icon (not the System Folder window) on your startup disk.**



A message tells you where the fonts will be stored inside the System Folder.

5. **Click OK.**

- △ **Important:** To use your Apple Font Pack fonts on a laser printer that uses PostScript, you must install version 7.1.2 or later of the LaserWriter driver. You can find the latest version of the LaserWriter driver on the disk labeled *Install*. Install the file labeled *LaserWriter* using the steps you follow to install a font. To find out whether your printer uses PostScript, see the documentation that came with it. △

Additional software and information

In addition to fonts and printer software, the Apple Font Pack disk labeled *Install* contains a Read Me document and the LaserWriter Utility program. To see the information in the Read Me file, double-click the Read Me icon.
