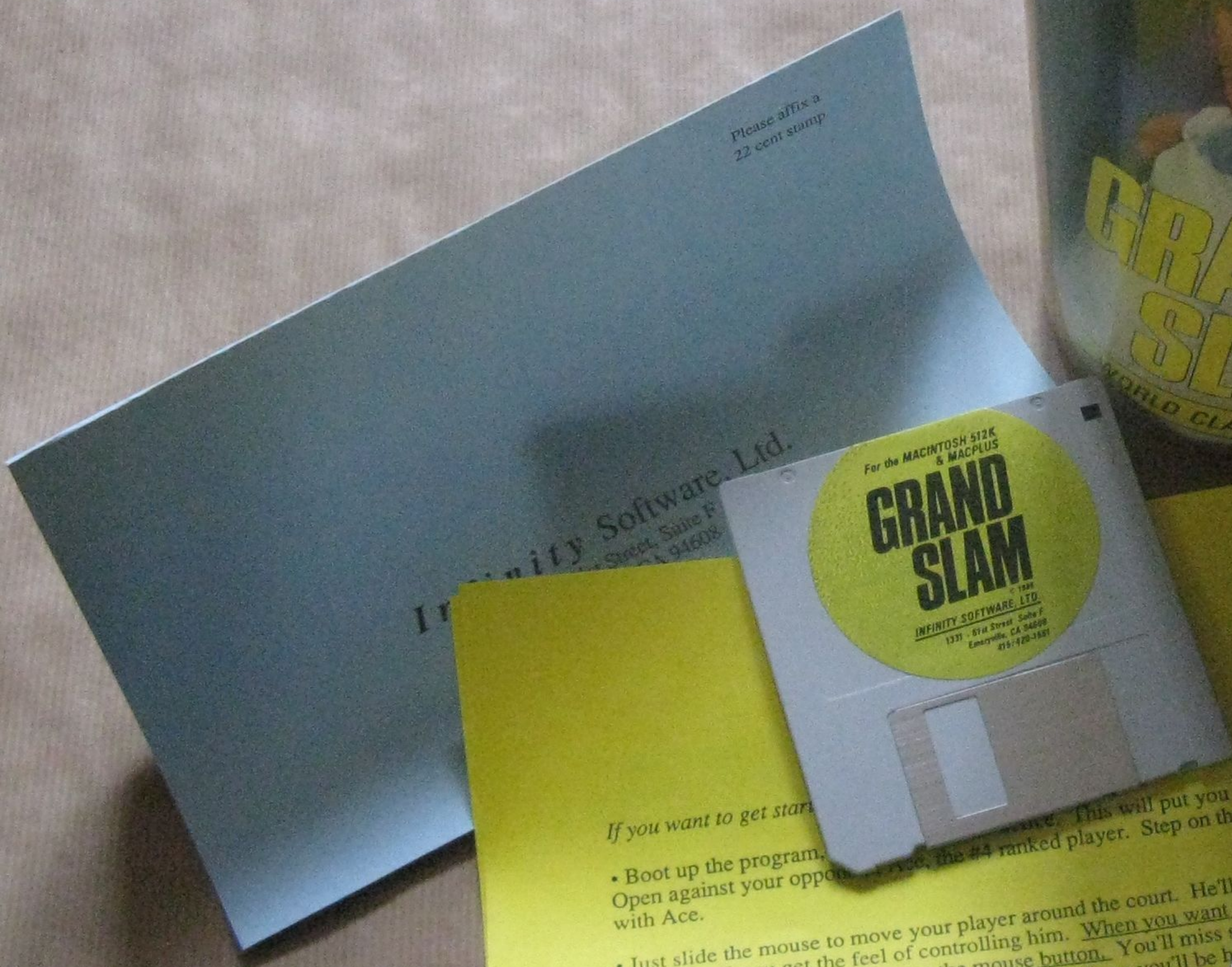
Then it's on to the fast grass of **Wimbledon**, where you can unleash the power of your serve-and-volley game... but watch out for rain and a slippery surface!

Quick Start *Grand Slam*

If you want to get started right away playing Grand Slam, here's how:

- Boot up the program, then click onto **Practice**. This will put you at the French Open against your opponent, Ace, the #4 ranked player. Step on the court and rally with Ace.
- Just slide the mouse to move your player around the court. He'll move pretty fast at first, until you get the feel of controlling him. When you want to hit either a forehand or backhand, click onto the mouse button. You'll miss some shots in the beginning, just as in real tennis. But be patient. Soon you'll be hitting backhands down the line for winners and putting away your volleys at net!
- In **Practice**, there is no scoring, although you'll be playing points, serving and rallying with your opponent.
- In **Practice**, to serve the ball to your opponent, press down on the SPACEBAR key. This tosses up the ball. Then, click onto the mouse to hit your serve. Again, patience is important to get the timing down on your toss and hit. Aim your serve diagonally to the forecourt box across the net from you. Ace will automatically move in position to return it. You get two chances to hit your serve in. Alternate serving diagonally from one box to the other.
- To get your opponent Ace to serve to you, just click on the mouse. Position your player a step or two inside the baseline to receive Ace's serve. Then click the mouse to return the ball when Ace's serve comes over the net. Alternate from side to side to receive serve, just as in real tennis.
- Once you've had a chance to practice and get the feel of stroking the ball, you'll want to try different menu choices. To get to the MENU BAR, just press down on the BACKSPACE key. By toggling this key, you stop and start the game, as well as access the different menu choices.
- Pull down the menus and choose from a variety of different courts, racquets, opponents, conditions, and tactics.
- To change the speed of the game, press the BACKSPACE key, then pull down the Conditions menu for Speed. Click onto one of the speed choices. This option lets

you slow down or speed up the entire game.

To Play a Grand Prix Tournament:

- Choose the **Grand Prix Tournament** Option. Complete the ENTRY FORM and select the TOURNEY you want to play. Once the players are ready, your name and your opponent's name will appear in the upper right corner of the screen by the scoreboard.
- Scoring is the same as real tennis, except there are no LETS in Grand Slam. That is, if the ball hits the top of the net and dribbles over, your opponent loses the point. Check the FILE menu by toggling the BACKSPACE key for tennis RULES, or refer to the documentation. Matches are best two out of three sets. Points are scored 15,30,40,Game. If the score is tied at 40-all, it is Deuce and you must win two points in a row to win the game. Check the Draw from the Grand Prix Points menu to chart your progress.
- To PROTEST a line call, either press the P key from the keyboard, or move your player to the Umpire's Chair, so that he is directly under the Chair, and click onto the mouse. A dialog box will then appear. Type in your Protest. If your Protest is successful, the Umpire will reverse the score and you'll be awarded the point.

Keyboard commands:

Press each key first, then click onto the mouse to make the shot

Serve=Spacebar

Slice=either Shift key

Lob=Command, or Enter

Smash=either Option key

Topsin=A, or '

Harder=X, or.

Softer=Z, or /

Menu Bar=Backspace key

Note: Just as in real tennis, it may take a while to get used to the speed of the game. For best results, play the game for a while, put it away, and then come back to it. Each time you return, you'll discover that you stroke the ball better, your timing is a little sharper, and you move around the court quicker. Grand Slam will be with you through the long tournament season. Good luck and watch out for those bad bounces at the Australian Open!
