Notes on External Applications: Interactive Features, Games and Interactive Ads


- 1. When you start an external application such as a game demonstration, the screen will go black for a few seconds while the game, feature or ad loads. Don't panic—this is normal.
- **2.** If you are done with a game demo, interactive feature or ad, you can always hit Q on the Mac or Alt F4 in Windows to get back to LAUNCH.
- 3. As LAUNCH reloads, the desktop may appear for a brief second. Again, this is normal. If LAUNCH fails to reload, just restart LAUNCH in the same way that you started the first time. (See Getting Started)

MechWarrior 2 (PC) You are a futuristic, robotic warrior forced to protect your clan's imperiled power base.


FX Fighter (PC) Experience virtual hand-to-hand combat on an eye-popping three-dimensional battlefield.


IN THIS ISSUE:

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Troubleshooting

- 1. Ouit all other applications before running LAUNCH
 - -Disabling all network connections and software will greatly improve video performance.
 - -On the Mac and PC/Windows you need to have 4.5MB of RAM available for LAUNCH to work properly
- 2. Make sure your computer meets the following requirements:

For PC/Windows:

486 33mhz machine w/ 8 MB RAM Soundcard (16 bit preferred) Double Speed CD-ROM drive Color Monitor 8bit (640x480x256) Speakers Windows 3.1 or higher QuickTime for Windows 2.0.3 Windows95 Compatible

Double Speed CD-ROM Drive Color Monitor System 7.1 OuickTime 2.0 (included) Sound Manager 3.1 (included)

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GETTING STARTED

PC/WINDOWS

1.Install QuickTime 2.0.3 (included on CD-ROM)

- From File Manager select your CD-ROM drive
- Open the sub-directory QTW20, and run setup.exe.
- If asked, remove any previous version of QuickTime
- 2. To run LAUNCH, return to the File Manager in Windows, and select your CD ROM drive. You have 2 choices:
 - For 256 colors, run LAUNCH.EXE
 - For 1000s of colors, run LAUNCH16.EXE
- It is recommended that users read the PCREADME.txt file for answers to frequently-asked technical questions.

MACINTOSH

- 1. Install QuickTime 2.0 components (included on CD-ROM)
 - Place the contents of the folder entitled "Put These in System Folder" into your System Folder. Click "OK" to install. Restart your Mac.
- 2. Start LAUNCH by clicking on the version that best fits your computer's set-up:
 - For 256 colors, run LAUNCH 8bit
 - For 1000s of colors, run LAUNCH 16bit
- It is recommended that users read the MAC READ ME file for answers to frequently-asked technical questions.

AUDIO TRACK - Insert LAUNCH into audio CD player and select Track 2.
