MANUAL ADDENDUM

Backup Disks: When you make backup disks to install or modify Star Trek, be sure to name all files and the disks themselves exactly the same as the original disks in order for the installer program to work properly.

PowerBooks: The PowerBook's power conservation features will make Star Trek's animation slow down dramatically, then disappear completely. The settings for these features are located in the "PowerBook" (formerly "Portable") Control Panel. To turn off these PowerBook features so that Star Trek's animation can continue uninterrupted, please consult your PowerBook manual.

Games: Some games are not fully compatible with Star Trek or screen savers in general, creating problems that do not occur in any other type of program. Examples of problems that can arise with games are memory conflicts, sound and display conflicts, or redrawing problems.

We do not have a list of incompatible games. If a game seems incompatible, you can turn Star Trek off with the "On/Off" switch in the After Dark Control Panel, or set a longer idle time in the "When" dialog box, to prevent Star Trek from activating while you play.

External monitors on a Mac Plus, SE or Classic: If Star Trek does not blank both the Mac and external monitors, rename "After Dark" to "--After Dark," then restart your Mac. Do not rename "After Dark Files."

Final Exam: The Final Exam module is not interactive in Randomizer, MultiModule or demo mode.

Sounder: The sound effects from Star Trek's sound file, located in the After Dark Files folder: Shared Resources folder, can be played through the Sounder module.

Spock: If you press the Caps Lock key while in demo mode, Spock will watch the cursor movements rather than perform his normal actions.

If you purchase and install After Dark after you have installed Star Trek: do not follow the installation instructions in the After Dark manual. Instead, on the After Dark master floppy disk open the folder After Dark Files, select all its files except MultiModule, MultiModule Settings, and Randomizer, and drag the selected files into the After Dark Files folder already on your hard disk. Do not copy the After Dark Control Panel from the After Dark master floppy disk; the Control Panel you have from installing Star Trek is the latest version. You do not need to restart.

If you purchase and install More After Dark after you have installed Star Trek: drag the Randomizer and MultiModule modules onto the desktop from the After Dark Files folder before you install More After Dark. This prevents the After Dark updater from replacing your current versions of Randomizer and MultiModule with older ones. After installation of More After Dark is complete, drag the Randomizer and MultiModule modules back into the After Dark Files folder.

QUICK START




Here are quick and easy instructions for getting Star Trek: The Screen Saver installed and running.

- Insert "Disk 1" and double-click on the "Double-Click Me to Install" icon.
- Click on "Install," and follow the on-screen directions. Type in your name, organization, and serial number (located on your registration card) when indicated.
- Fill out your registration card while you wait for installation to complete.
- Star Trek runs its display modules using the After Dark engine. Once installation is complete, you can open Star Trek by selecting "Control Panel" from the Apple menu. Then open the After Dark Control Panel.
- You can now select any of the Star Trek modules in the Control Panel and view them by putting your mouse cursor all the way into the lower left corner of your monitor, or by clicking on the "Demo" button.
- Star Trek is automatically set to "sleep" after 10 minutes of screen inactivity.

For more complete information about setting a personal password and configuring your Star Trek setup, see Section 3, "Using Star Trek."

SECTION ONE: WELCOME



ABOUT STAR TREK®: THE SCREEN SAVER

Welcome to Star Trek: The Screen Saver. Its mission: to save your screen from phosphor burn-in. When you leave your Macintosh screen on but inactive, screen phosphor is destroyed. After an extended period of time, the image being displayed can *burn in* to your screen, causing a permanent ghost image. Star Trek's prime directive is to sense when your screen has been inactive for a set period of time and present screen-saving animated displays.

It's the logical alternative to screen burn-in!

A NOTE ABOUT THE AFTER DARK ENGINE

Star Trek: The Screen Saver uses the world famous After Dark engine to run its exciting array of displays. After Dark is the original modular screen saver, with over 30 displays, including classic Flying Toasters and tropical Fish. The After Dark package with all of its displays can be purchased from software dealers everywhere.

BEFORE YOU DO ANYTHING ELSE

Make backup copies of the enclosed diskettes. Make sure that the disk and file names on your backup copies are identical to the masters for the installer to work correctly. Use these backup copies to install or modify Star Trek. Keep your original diskettes in a safe, dust-free location away from magnetic fields. Keep your master and backup disks locked to prevent accidental erasure.



NOTE: Fill out and send in your registration card! It's the best way for us to assure you of warp-speed customer service and technical support, and make sure you never miss an update, new product information, or other special offer that we might send your way.

Be sure to separate the two-part registration card and attach your half to this manual for a permanent record of your serial number.

ABOUT THIS MANUAL

This manual assumes a basic familiarity with the operation of a Macintosh computer, e.g., using the mouse, clicking and dragging, and the location of the System Folder. For more information on Macintosh operation, please consult your Macintosh user's manual.



Star Trek is System 7 compatible.

SECTION TWO: INSTALLING STAR TREK



There are two methods for installing Star Trek. The first, Easy Install, installs all the necessary files in their proper locations. The second method, Custom Install, gives you the option of not installing particular files. The most common reason for using Custom Install is to omit graphics or sounds files in order to conserve hard disk space.



CAUTION: We strongly recommend that you use the Easy Install option so that you do not inadvertently omit required program files.



NOTE: If you already have After Dark on your computer, run the "Easy Install" to allow Star Trek to update After Dark automatically. Your After Dark modules will appear in your new Star Trek edition of the After Dark Control Panel.


Before installing, please turn off all anti-virus and security programs that are running, and quit all applications. Also, to avoid conflicts, please remove any other screen saver programs, except After Dark, from your System Folder.

EASY INSTALL

- Insert "Disk 1."
- Double-click on the "Double-Click Me to Install" icon.
- An introduction screen will appear with information about Star Trek. Click "OK."



CAUTION: You MUST install the Control Panel and the Black & White Art files for Star Trek to run properly.




- Use the “Switch Disk” button if you would like to install to a disk other than the one named.
- Click on “Install.”
- Enter your name, organization, and product serial number (located on your registration card) in the dialog box that appears, and click “OK.”
- Fill out your registration card while you wait for the installation to complete.
- Follow the on-screen directions, and insert the remaining disks when prompted. When installation is complete, you will be prompted to restart your machine.

That's it! Now just say, “Beam me up” and begin your journey...

CUSTOM INSTALL

- Insert "Disk 1."
- Double-click on the "Double-Click Me to Install" icon.
- An introduction screen will appear with information about Star Trek. Click "OK."
- Use the "Switch Disk" button if you would like to install to a disk other than the one named.
- Click on "Customize." A custom install screen will appear:



- Select the items in the scrollable list you wish to install. Hold down the shift key while you click to choose multiple items. Each individual item you select will produce an information screen below the list, showing the size, date, and version number of the selected item.



CAUTION: You **MUST** install the Control Panel and the Black & White Art files for Star Trek to run properly.

- Once you have made your installation selections, click on "Install."
- Enter your name, organization, and product serial number (located on your registration card) in the dialog box that appears, and click "OK."
- Fill out your registration card while you wait for the installation to complete.
- You will be prompted to insert the remaining disks as the installation completes.
- When the installation is complete, you will be prompted to restart your machine. You're ready to beam aboard the U.S.S. Enterprise™!

BLACK AND WHITE MACS ONLY

If you install Star Trek on a Macintosh that cannot display color graphics, Star Trek will automatically install only black and white art files to save you disk space. If you later upgrade to a color Macintosh, simply reinstall Star Trek rather than transferring the files directly, and be sure to install the "Color Art" files (either by using the Easy Install, or by selecting the file in the Custom Install).

OPTIONAL FILES

In order to save disk space, you may choose to omit the following files by not selecting them in "Custom Install."

STAR TREK SOUNDS

Star Trek's modules will have no sound effects without this file. The speaker icon in the After Dark Control Panel will still be visible, however.

STAR TREK MODULES

You can choose to omit some or all of Star Trek's modules. Please note that if you don't install any modules, Star Trek will run only the default module, "Starry Night."

ART FILES

You can omit the Color Art files to save disk space. These files contain shared art for all the Star Trek modules. Because some individual modules have their own internal color art, you will still see color in some modules if you omit this file.



CAUTION: You must NOT remove the Black & White Art files for Star Trek to run properly.

LOCATION OF FILES

"AFTER DARK FILES" FOLDER

Do NOT rename this folder. It must be in one of the following locations:

<i>System 6</i>	System Folder
<i>System 7</i>	Control Panels folder (placed here at installation) Extensions folder Preferences folder Desktop Top level of the System Folder

AFTER DARK PROGRAM

The After Dark program must also be located correctly, as follows:

<i>System 6</i>	System Folder
<i>System 7</i>	Control Panels Folder (preferred) Extensions folder Top level of the System Folder



NOTE: For System 7 users: for convenience, you can use the "Make Alias" command from the File menu to make an alias of the After Dark program to put in your Apple menu or on your desktop. You may assign your alias any name. To access the After Dark Control Panel from your Apple menu, just click on the Apple in the upper left corner of your screen, drag down to the alias and release.

UNINSTALL OPTION

If for some reason you need to uninstall all or part of Star Trek, use the Custom option of the Installer program:

- Insert "Disk 1."

- Click on "Customize."
- In the list of options, select the files you want to remove, or the "Full Install" choice if you wish to *uninstall* the entire program.
- Hold down the "Option" key on the keyboard. The "Install" button will change to a "Remove" button.
- Continue holding down the "Option" key and click the "Remove" button.

BLACK AND WHITE MACINTOSH

If you install Star Trek on a Macintosh that displays color graphics, Star Trek will automatically place the system files in the "Color" folder. If you later upgrade to a color Macintosh, simply reinstall Star Trek rather than transferring the files directly. And, be sure to place the system files in the "Color" folder when using the Easy Install or Manual Install options. The After Dark program must also be located correctly, as follows:

OPTIONAL FILES

In order to save space, the After Dark program does not install optional files. To install these files, select them in the "Customize" menu in the "After Dark" folder.

STARTREK SOUNDS

NOTE: For System 7 users, for convenience you can use the "Make Alias" command from the File menu to make an alias of the After Dark program in your Apple menu or on your desktop. You may assign your alias any name. To access the After Dark Control Panel from your Apple menu, just click on the Apple in the menu bar, then click on the screen, drag down to the alias and release.


You can choose to limit some or all of Star Trek's modules. Please note that if you don't install any modules, Star Trek will run only the default module, "Starry Night."

UNINSTALL OPTION

ART FILES


If for some reason you need to uninstall all or part of Star Trek, use the Custom option of the Installer program. The details of the Installer program are shared art for all the Star Trek modules. Because some individual modules have their own internal color art, you will still see color in some modules even if you uninstall this file.

SECTION THREE: USING STAR TREK



THE CONTROL PANEL

The icon for the After Dark Control Panel will have been automatically placed in your Macintosh Control Panel or Control Panels folder by the installer. You can open Star Trek by selecting "Control Panel" from the Apple menu. Then open the After Dark Control Panel.



Star Trek is a modular screen saver that allows you to select from a variety of graphic displays.

- To select a display module, click on its name in the scrollable list, or type the first few letters of its name. The module you leave selected will be the one that runs when Star Trek activates.
- For more information about a selected module, click on the Info triangle at the bottom right of the Control Panel. Click anywhere in the Info box to return to the Control Panel. The Info boxes provide Star Trek trivia and information on module controls.

- To preview a selected module, click on the “Demo” button. The module will come on behind the Control Panel. The Control Panel will disappear except for the controls.

Play with the control settings as much as you want, even during a demo. You’re the captain of this mission—experiment until you find what you like!

- Click “Stop” to end the demo.
- Click anywhere in the After Dark logo area to view the Star Trek credits. Click again to return to the Control Panel.

ON/OFF SWITCH

The On/Off switch at the top right corner of the Control Panel can be used to turn Star Trek off completely and turn it back on again. Star Trek will NOT sleep while turned off.

CHANGING THE LIST OF DISPLAYS

Each module listed in the Control Panel is a file in the After Dark Files folder. Add or remove a module from the Control Panel list by adding or removing its icon from the After Dark Files folder. The Control Panel must be closed and reopened to reflect changes made to the modules list.



NOTE: To place your favorite modules at the top of the Control Panel list, add a space or a number before its name in the After Dark Files folder.

KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS


Type the first few letters of a module’s name to locate it quickly in the Control Panel list. (All Star Trek module names begin with a space!) Move through the scrollable list using the up and down arrows on the keyboard, or the Page Up, Page Down, Home and End keys on an extended keyboard.

SOUND

In all modules with sound, a speaker icon will be visible next to the Demo button. Click on the up and down arrows to control the volume of a module.

THE SETUP DIALOG BOX

Click on the “When” button in the upper right corner of the Control Panel to access the Setup dialog box:





SET SLEEP TIME

Type in the number of “idle” minutes desired before your selected screen saver module activates. The default idle time is 10 minutes. Your screen will “sleep” when no keys have been struck and the mouse is not moved or clicked for the idle time set.

Reawaken your screen with any keystroke or by moving the mouse.

“SLEEP NOW,” “NEVER SLEEP” CORNERS

On the representative screen in the setup dialog are the “Sleep Now”  and “Never Sleep”  symbols.

The “Sleep Now” corner allows you to put your screen to sleep instantly. Simply move your mouse pointer into the designated corner of your actual monitor screen.

The "Never Sleep" corner will prevent Star Trek from sleeping when you leave the mouse pointer in the designated corner of your actual monitor screen.

You can change the positions of the "Sleep Now" and "Never Sleep" corners by dragging their symbols to different corners of the representative screen. You may place these symbols in any corner of the screen you wish, but both cannot occupy the same corner.



NOTE: When you use the "Sleep Now" or "Never Sleep" corners, be sure you move the mouse pointer on your actual monitor screen as far into the appropriate corner as it can go (until you can't see it anymore). The ☐ symbol will not be visible on your screen when you use the "Sleep Now" corner. The mouse pointer will change into the ☐ symbol while it is in the "Never Sleep" corner.

"NO SLEEP CORNERS" CHECKBOX

You can disable the "Sleep Now" and "Never Sleep" corners by checking this box. You may prefer this option if you don't want your screen to accidentally sleep or stay awake should you move the pointer to those corners.

"NO ICON AT STARTUP" CHECKBOX

Use this checkbox to prevent the After Dark icon from appearing on your screen when your machine boots. You may prefer this if you have a custom startup screen.

SYSTEMIQ™ ACTIVITY MONITOR

With SystemIQ, Star Trek will monitor your system activity and adjust itself accordingly. At normal activity levels, Star Trek "times out" for the idle time you've specified, and sleeps when there has been no activity for that time. SystemIQ will prevent the screen saver from timing out and engaging while there is printer or modem port activity, or if disk access or CPU load is above a certain level. SystemIQ is set to "on" automatically, its checkbox checked, when Star Trek is first installed.

If Star Trek is already running when the activity level rises, it will continue to sleep but will "throttle back" to prevent competition with other system tasks, such as file transfers, backups, and mathematical processing. Animation will slow to one animation frame per second and sound will be turned off while Star Trek is throttled back.

“PLEASE WAKE UP” CHECKBOX

Some programs try to get your attention while your screen is sleeping by displaying the message “Please wake up!” across the top of your screen. You can prevent this message from appearing on your sleeping screen by unchecking this box.

MUTE SOUND CHECKBOX


You can mute all the Star Trek modules’ sounds by checking this box. The speaker icon will disappear while the box is checked.

MUTE SOUND HOT KEY

You can mute sound instantly while Star Trek is asleep simply by pressing the “Control” key. The mute key will mute sounds even on password protected machines. This hot key feature is not supported on the Macintosh Plus. To resume having sound, just wake up Star Trek and put it back to sleep.

PASSWORD PROTECTION

You can set a password to prevent prying Romulans (or anyone else) from waking up your screen. To do so, click the “Password” button in the Setup Dialog box. This dialog will appear:



- To assign a password, type in your desired password. Star Trek will prompt you to retype your password to confirm it.
- To change a password, Star Trek will prompt you for the “Old password,” then ask for a “New password,” and then ask to “Confirm new password.”

When typing your password, apples will appear instead of letters, to prevent anyone from learning your password by looking over your shoulder.

- For *automatic* password protection, check the “Always require password” box in the Setup dialog. Password protection will be engaged whenever Star Trek sleeps.

- For *manual* password protection (if the "Always require password" box is not checked) hold down the Option and ⌘ keys while putting the pointer in your "Sleep Now" corner.



CAUTION: You cannot use manual password protection if you have disabled the "Sleep Now" corner by checking the "No sleep corners" box.

- To wake your screen while password protected, type your password, then hit Return or Enter.


When your screen is asleep in password mode, Password Protection will stay in effect across restarts. If your machine is turned off and back on, or the programmer's switch is hit, password protection will be maintained when your machine reboots.



CAUTION: Password protection will NOT be in effect across a restart unless your screen is asleep in password mode when the restart is attempted.

"I FORGOT MY PASSWORD!"

Don't panic. You can override your Star Trek password by restarting from a different startup disk. Then reinstall Star Trek from your original or backup disks, and restart your machine. You will need to re-enter a password to continue having Password Protection.




With SystemQ, Star Trek will monitor your system activity and adjust accordingly. At normal activity levels, Star Trek "times out" for the idle screen.

SystemQ will prevent the screen from going into password protection while there is printer or modem port activity, or if disk access or CPU load is above a certain level. When Star Trek times out, you will be prompted for your password. If you forget your password, then ask for a "New password," and then ask to "Confirm new password."

When you enter a password, Star Trek will adjust system activity to match the level of your activity. For example, if you are doing heavy tasks such as file transfers, backups, and mathematical processing, animation will slow down. If you are doing light tasks, animation will speed up. The "Always require password" box in the setup dialog. Password protection will be engaged if the screen sleeps.

SECTION FOUR: SPECIAL FEATURES



DISPLAY OVER SHUT DOWN ALERT

Some Macintoshes will display the message "You may now switch off your Macintosh safely" at shut down time. The default module, Starry Night, will come on if you don't switch off your machine after your set idle time, to prevent the Shut Down message from burning into your screen.



NOTE: Only the default module, "Starry Night," can be displayed when your disk is shut down. No password will be in effect when you restart.

ALERT DIALOGS AND NOTIFICATION MANAGER

When an Alert Dialog is sent by your computer while Star Trek is sleeping, it will wake up your screen. If there is no further activity, your Mac will go back to sleep after your set idle time.


The Notification Manager is used by programs such as Alarm Clock, QuickMail™, and PrintMonitor to get your attention. It will wake up your screen, which will sleep after your set idle time if there is no more activity. It will leave an icon and a "Please wake up!" message scrolling across the top of your sleeping screen.

You can turn off the scrolling message by unchecking the "Please wake up" checkbox in the After Dark Control Panel's Setup dialog box.

SCREEN SHOTS

You can use the keyboard shortcut ⌘-Shift-3 to take screen shots of Star Trek screens. These shots will be stored on the top level of your hard disk as "Picture 1," "Picture 2," etc.

SECTION FIVE: THE MODULES



From the Starship Enterprise™ soaring around the curve of a great planet, to trilling Tribbles, to Mr. Spock's observations of your desktop, the Star Trek modules will transport you to strange new worlds.

Explore a module by selecting its name in the After Dark Control Panel and experimenting with its controls. Preview your selected module by clicking on "Demo" in the After Dark Control Panel. End the demo at any time by clicking on "Stop." For extra information on a selected module, click on the Info triangle in the lower right corner of the Control Panel. Click anywhere in the Info box to return to the Control Panel.



NOTE: If you have After Dark, you will also see your After Dark modules listed in the Control Panel list. The After Dark and Star Trek modules are compatible for interaction in MultiModule and Randomizer.

Star Trek's special modules are described below:

STARRY NIGHT


Starry Night is Star Trek's default module. It does not have a file in the After Dark Files folder. Starry Night will engage if for some reason your selected module cannot run.

COMMUNICATIONS

Leave messages on your computer screen for fellow crew members (or friends, family or co-workers) about your current mission, whereabouts, or feelings on matters great and small.

Choose the "Style" (including our "Hortavetica" and "Zap Klingon" fonts) and "Message" from the pop-up menus on the Control Panel.

To edit or create a new message, click on "Edit Custom...." Type your message in the dialog box that appears, and click "OK." Set the "Message" menu to "Custom" to display your message when Star Trek sleeps.




RANDOMIZER

With Randomizer you can select any or all of the Star Trek modules to display in random or sequential order. You can set the length of time for each module to display, from a few seconds to a new module each time your screen sleeps.

To set your Randomizer display:

- Select Randomizer in the After Dark Control Panel.
- Click on "Choose...." The following dialog box will appear:




- Highlight the modules you want to display. You can highlight a group of modules by holding down the mouse button while you drag through the list, or holding down the Shift key as you click on different module names to select them.
- Click "OK."
- In the Randomizer controls, choose In Order or Random sequence for the displays, and set the display Duration.
- Check the "Clear Screen" box to black out the screen between displays.

THE AMAZING MULTIMODULE™

With MultiModule you can run several modules on the same screen, side-by-side or overlapping, in any size or position you like.

To create a MultiModule:

- Select MultiModule in the Control Panel list.
- Click the "New" button to create a MultiModule. The following display edit screen will appear:




- Select the modules you want to use in your display. When you select a module, a display box with the module's name in the upper left corner will appear in the layout screen on the right.
- To remove a module from the display, deselect it in the list by clicking on it, or click on its display box and hit Delete.
- Use the handles (black corner boxes) of a selected display to resize it.
- Make a selected display "transparent" by clicking on the "transparent" button to see other displays' effects through it.
- Drag a selected display to any location you wish on the layout screen. If the display is set to "transparent," drag it by its name box.
- Use the Frontward and Backward icon buttons to "shuffle" a selected display up or down in a stack of displays.
- When you're finished setting up your new display, click in the "Name of settings" text box and type in the name of your new MultiModule creation.
- Click "OK." Your new setting is now listed in the pop-up menu in MultiModule's controls.
- To edit a setting, select it in the pop-up menu and click "Edit" to be returned to the display edit screen. To delete a setting, select it and click "Delete."

SOUNDER

Sounder allows you to play SoundEdit™ files, System 7 format sounds, and Star Trek's "Shared Sound" file, either alone or in combination with other modules in MultiModule.

- To use Sounder, click on the "Folder..." button. In the dialog box that appears, choose the folder containing the sounds you wish to play. Sounder has been preset to play sounds from Star Trek's "Shared Sounds" file. That file is located in the Shared Resources folder inside the After Dark Files folder.



NOTE: For the best in authentic Star Trek sound effects, music, and dialog from the original television series, we recommend the Star Trek sounds volumes "The Logical Collection" and "The Final Frontier," from Sound Source, Unlimited. Each volume contains over 50 high-quality AudioClips™, which can be run through Sounder and combined with your favorite Star Trek modules in MultiModule. Refer to the Sound Source user's manual for details on installation and file locations for that product.

- Check the "Play all sounds in folder" box for all the sounds in that folder to play in sequence. To play just one sound from a folder, leave the "Play all sounds..." box unchecked, and select only the sound you want to play from the folder.
- In Sounder's Control Panel, set the Sound Delay slider and check the "Clear Screen" box to have the screen blank when Sounder plays. Check the "Show file name" box to have the name of the sound file being played appear on the screen.

FINAL EXAM

We know you've been studying hard for this most important moment. This is your Starfleet Academy Final Exam—the true test of your knowledge of the Federation's Starfleet and its most famous starship, the U.S.S. Enterprise™. Keep your eyes on your own screen, please. And don't be nervous; naturally, only the best of the Starfleet Cadets make it through the Academy to this exam!


To proceed with the exam:

- In the Final Exam controls, set the time limit you wish to be allotted to answer each question (5 to 30 seconds). Check the "Show Answer" box if you are reviewing rather than taking the test. The correct answer to each question will be left onscreen briefly before the next question. Check the "Text Only" box to remove all graphics from your test.
- Press the "Caps Lock" key to begin your exam.
- This exam is multiple choice. A question and four possible answers will appear on your screen. An onscreen clock will begin counting down the time you have set in the controls to answer the question. Select your answer by pressing the number key (on your main keyboard or the numeric keypad) corresponding to the number of the answer you've chosen.
- If you do not put the test into interactive mode by pressing "Caps Lock," the test will simply cycle through the questions automatically. If you have checked the "Show Answer" Box in the controls, the wrong answers will disappear from the screen for each question, leaving the correct answer displayed briefly. If you stop taking the exam or the module is left in automatic mode, the test will display only text after ninety minutes to prevent burn-in of stationary graphics.



CAUTION: You cannot take your Final Exam while in Randomizer, MultiModule, demo mode, or while Star Trek is in password protected sleep.

SECTION SIX: TROUBLESHOOTING



Here are a few of the more common problems you could encounter with Star Trek. If you need help beyond what is covered here, please consult the last section of this manual, "About Technical Support," for information on utilizing our Tech Support Services.

Where's Star Trek and What's After Dark?!

Star Trek: The Screen Saver is run by the After Dark engine, developed by Berkeley Systems for our original modular screen saver, After Dark. The files and Control Panel based on the After Dark engine are named "After Dark." This provides complete compatibility with the original After Dark screen saver collection and will allow compatibility with future After Dark-based screen savers.

The Only Module That Runs Is "Starry Night."

This usually happens because your After Dark Files folder is in the wrong place or has been renamed. Make sure it is named exactly *After Dark Files* and is in the correct location. In System 7, it can be in the top level of the System Folder, the Extensions folder, the Control Panels folder, the Preferences folder or on the Desktop. In System 6, it must be in the System Folder.

This can also happen when your selected module cannot run for some reason (e.g., not enough available memory). A scrolling message will appear at the top of your screen at these times.

When Opening the After Dark Control Panel, I Get A "Not Installed" Message, Even After I Restart.

Check that the After Dark program is in the right location: for System 6, it must be inside the System Folder. For System 7, make sure it is in either the Control Panels folder (preferred), the Extensions folder, or the top level of the System Folder.

Check that Star Trek is enabled if you use an extension or INIT manager program.

If Star Trek still won't open, your After Dark Control Panel may be damaged. Try running the installer from your backup disks to automatically replace it with a new one.

The After Dark Program's Icon Is Not In My Control Panel.

Make sure the After Dark program is in the correct location, as noted above and in the "Installation" section of this manual. If the program is not in one of those places, move it to the correct location and then restart your machine.



NOTE: In System 7, users may make an alias of the After Dark icon and place it in their Apple menu or on their desktops for more convenient access to Star Trek.

Star Trek Crashes, Or Conflicts With Another Program.

There are several possible causes for a crash or conflict. Try to pinpoint the problem by reproducing the situation that first caused the crash or conflict. In some cases, simply restarting your Macintosh will solve the problem. If the problem persists, try reinstalling Star Trek from your backup or original diskettes.

If you continue to have problems, please consult the following section on utilizing our Technical Support department.

Star Trek Conflicts With PowerBook Features.

The PowerBook's power conservation features will make Star Trek's animation slow down dramatically, then disappear completely. The settings for these features are located in the "PowerBook" (formerly "Portable") Control Panel. To turn off these features so that Star Trek's animation can continue uninterrupted, please consult your PowerBook manual.

The PowerBook's System Sleep feature will not operate with Star Trek running.

Games Conflict with Star Trek

Some games are not fully compatible with Star Trek or screen savers in general, creating problems that do not occur in any other type of program. Examples of problems that can arise with games are memory conflicts, sound and display conflicts, or redrawing problems.

We do not have a list of incompatible games. If a game seems incompatible, you can turn Star Trek off with the "On/Off" switch in the After Dark Control Panel, or set a longer idle time in the "When" dialog box, to prevent Star Trek from activating while you play.


External Monitors on a Mac Plus, SE, or Classic.

If Star Trek does not blank both the Mac and external monitors, rename "After Dark" to "~~After Dark," then restart your Mac. Do not rename "After Dark Files."
