



Simple Navigation Tips

- To go from page to page, use the right (forward) and left (backward) arrows on the keyboard.
- All functions are available from the tool palette or the menu bar.
 To display the tool palette, click the gray area on the right side of the screen.

To display the menu bar, move the mouse to the top of the screen.

- To search for a word in the text, hold down the mouse button over the word and select a search option from the displayed pop-up.
- To return to the last page you were reading, click Retrace on the tool
 palette. To choose from a list of pages you recently read, hold the

INSTALLING AN EXPANDED BOOK

Extracting the Compressed Files

- 1. Double-click the icon for the Expanded Book diskette.
- Open the Read Me First file and review it for important information about the specific Expanded Book. (If your Expanded Book was shipped on more than one diskette, the Read Me First file may contain special installation instructions.)
- 3. Locate and double-click the self-extracting archive for the Expanded Book. (The file whose name ends in ".sea" is the self-extracting archive.)
- 4. Select a destination on your hard drive for the Expanded Book files.
- 5 Click Save

The files will decompress automatically and be installed in the location you selected.

Installing Fonts

BEFORE YOU START

To get ready to install Expanded Book fonts, perform these steps:

- 1. Quit all open applications and desk accessories.
- Open the folder on your hard drive that was created when you decompressed the files, and locate the font suitcase for your Expanded Book.

INSTALLING FONTS FOR SYSTEM 6

If you're using system software version 6.0.7 or 6.0.8, you must use Apple's Font/DA Mover, which is a part of your system software. To install the fonts, perform these steps:

- 1. Double-click the font suitcase.
- 2. Click the Open button below the empty list box.
- 3. Select your System file.
- 4 Select all the fonts in the list box by holding down the <Shift> key while you click each font's name.
- 5. Make sure the arrows on the Copy button are pointing from the list of fonts to your System file.
- 6. Click Copy.
- 7. When you have finished installing the fonts, click Quit.

INSTALLING FONTS FOR SYSTEM 7

If you're using System 7, drag the font suitcase over the System Folder icon on your hard drive and drop it. The Macintosh will guide you through the rest of the font installation.

Installing the Expanded Book

IF THIS IS YOUR FIRST EXPANDED BOOK...

Rename the folder that was created when you decompressed the Expanded Book file to "Expanded Books." Any other Expanded Books that you install in the future should be placed in this folder.

IF YOU HAVE OTHER EXPANDED BOOKS...

- Drag your new Expanded Book stack (and its Annotations stack, if present) to the folder where you keep your Expanded Books.
- 2. If the copies of The Notebook and The Library in your Expanded Books folder are older than the copies that came with the new Expanded Book, you must replace the older copies. To check the version numbers of The Notebook and The Library, follow the instructions in the Read Me First file that came with the new Expanded Book.

Expanded Books and Memory

Most Expanded Books run best with at least 1,200K of RAM available and allocated to HyperCard. To allocate memory to HyperCard, perform these steps:

- 1. Locate your copy of HyperCard on the hard drive and select it.
- From the File menu, choose "Get Info". The HyperCard Info window will appear.
- 3. Enter "1200" in the box at the lower-right corner of the HyperCard Info window.
- 4. Close the HyperCard Info window.

Note: Some Expanded Books have special features, which may require you to allocate more memory to HyperCard. See the Read Me First file for memory information specific to your Expanded Book.

READING AN EXPANDED BOOK

Personalizing Your Book

The first time you launch an Expanded Book, you'll be asked to enter your name. Type your name the way you want it to appear in the bookplate ("This Book Belongs to...") at the beginning of the book.
